

Managing Ergonomic Risk:


- Collecting information on task requirements
- · Communicating and consulting with staff
- Using evidence based risk assessment tools to (e.g. Use of Manual Handling Assessment (MAC) Tool)
- Developing appropriate or innovative solutions to reduce or eliminate risk
- Transferring knowledge of new control measures or solutions in place
- Influencing management



Statistics

- The occupational illness rate increased from 21.7 per 1,000 workers in 2001 to 27.1 per 1,000 workers in 2012. Musculoskeletal disorders account for over 60% of all illnesses. (ESRI 2015)
- Manual Handling continues to be the most common accident trigger accounting for 33% of all reported non-fatal accidents
 (Health and Safety Authority Summary of Workplace Injury, Illness and Fatality Statistics 2016)
- 28% of over 10000 occupational injury benefit claims relate to injuries to the back, with an average of 57 lost days
 (Occupational Injury Benefit Claims, Department of Social Protection 2015)







Ergonomics and its legal context

- The Manual Handling of Loads Regulation
- The Display Screen Equipment Regulation







Strategy of the Health and Safety Authority 2016-2018: Focus on health risks in the workplace.

- Increase the knowledge and understanding of occupational health and welfare risks.
- Raise awareness of the value of controlling occupational health risks and promoting positive health and well-being.
- Ensure legal compliance through proportionate enforcement
- Influence the EU agenda on laws and policy on occupational health.



Ensure legal compliance through proportionate enforcement

- New Operational Minute for Inspectors which gives guidance on addressing ergonomic issues during inspection
- 250 Inspections addressing the management of Ergonomic risk in the workplace;
